School funding request details:

ROAR cards (Tim Mushumanski) all students- *\$1,800 in gift card prizes* - Approved unanimously via Executive motion on October 16, 2024.

- A. *Ratified:* by Colleen Thomas and [a parent online] The suggestion was made that the PAC have conversation in the spring about the effectiveness of this program.
- B. Grade 9 boys track and basketball teams (Jesse Anast teacher sponsor) 30 track/basketball home/away reversible jerseys funds requested \$1,256.00

This request was withdrawn by the basketball reps in attendance (Caroline St G and Janeen M). Basketball's priority is

assistance for travel costs for their required SD8 employee sponsor.

C. Grade 9 Basketball – (Caroline St-Germain and other parents) – specific request for funding of travel and accomodations for SD8 teacher sponsor to tournaments including those in the Okanagan and Vancouver– no specific dollar amount. Plans are uncertain at this point so no real idea of budget or funds needed.

PAC agreed to fund \$2400 for this specific purpose

D. Pride Club - 15+ kids - student club (Jen Bailey teacher sponsor).
Request: *\$1,000* for beading pronoun badge project, button maker and occasional pizza/snacks.

PAC agreed to fund \$500 (\$150 for beading project, \$200 button maker machine and \$150 towards pizza lunch)

E. Library – (Karen Walgren – Librarian) All Students - \$2,000 - \$1,000 for graphic novel/book replacement and Elephant Mountain Literacy Author Visit (\$700 - \$1,000)

English and French graphic novels are in high demand and current copies are in poor repair. In and out daily use with double the circulation of regular books. Graphic novels also cost more than regular books. Author visit last year was amazing - students were engaged and presenting author was the best yet. 3/4 of the school's students participated! Librarian would love to have PAC provide this again.

PAC agreed to fund \$750 for replacing graphic novels. Elephant Mountain Lit Society will cover the cost for the author visit in the spring.

F. Band Sun Peaks Festival trip (Justin Ratzberg teacher via Band rep) - 55 Gr 8 & 9 students - \$5,000 for transportation plus performance uniforms that will stay at the school. Last year PAC matched parent donation of \$3675 and 27 kids went on trip.

PAC agreed to fund \$2400 toward travel costs (bus)

- G. Drama/Musical theatre production "Wonka" (Amy McKay teacher) -60+ kids - *\$1,200 wigs*, make up and other costume and prop needs, starter funds to purchase candy for fundraiser.
 PAC agreed to fund \$750, primarily toward costume needs, etc.
- H. Spike Ball games (Class 6-1 MS Sierra teacher via parent Colleen O'Hara) general request - no specific \$ amount.
 Request withdrawn
- Zine Club (Sharon Inkpen teacher) 30 students General request for funding. Samount not yet provided
 Motion: Bruce makes a motion to approve funding as following: \$2400 for basketball, \$500 for Pride, \$750 for library support, \$2400 to band, \$750 for drama. This leaves \$2280 still available of 2024-25 Gaming grant of \$11,280 2nd/ Lorien. 1 not in favour. Approved.

Zero tolerance for individual actions but not for students (meaning, students will not be kicked out permanently).

There is online reporting, can be done anonymously. But this is not a foolproof solution.

Nona would love to see Scott Rothermel in person and it's free. He does 3 different talks. Parents can come with or without their kids.

Suggests that the Pride club could be a Pride and Anti-Racism club. An Ally club.

Breanne asked about Zin / Zyn – snuff packets that kids are using. Discussion tabled for future meeting.

TREASURERS REPORT – NOVEMBER 12, 2024

-No activity in bank accounts. Community Account Balance: \$5,013.65. Gaming Account Balance: \$20,691.75 comprised of current year Gaming Grant \$11,280 (together with a float (working capital) of \$9,411.75)

- Activity since last PAC meeting mostly set up or the year, updating signing authorities, reviewing prior years books and records, reviewing funding requests etc

- An unanimous Executive motion was approved for \$1,800 to fund TMS Roar Card program again this year. The program is already underway.

FUNDING REQUESTS

- Background information: 2024-25 Gaming Grant = \$11,280. \$1,800 of this is reserved for Roar Card program.

- In addition, some portion of the remaining balance needs to be reserved for future funding requests / later in the year (we ought not allocate the amount out this early in the school year).

- Funding requests (including Roar) to date total \$12,256, exceeding available funds. Treasurer's recommended allocations are below, totalling \$7,556. If approved would leave \$3,724 available funding for the balance of the school year.

MOTION BASED ON TREASURER'S RECOMMENDATIONS

Moved that PAC approve the following funding:

- A. Ratification of \$1,800 Roar Card funding unanimously approved by Executive in October.
- B. Either \$1,256 for boys track and basketball team reversible jerseys, <u>OR</u>, in the alternative C
- C. \$1,256 general funding for basketball team (Tournament Fees, travel funding for volunteer coach, etc.)
- D. \$500 Pride Club to fund pronoun beading project (\$150), button maker machine (\$200) and support towards the club's pizza lunch hosting (\$150).
- E. \$750 for Library graphic novel replacement / enhancement. (Author Visit funding request deferred pending potential EML funding)

- F. \$2,250 Band Sun Peaks Festival travel contribution.
- G. \$1,000 Drama production "Wonka" for wigs, make up, costume and prop needs.
- H. Spike Ball request withdrawn (nil).
- I. Zine Club insufficient information currently available (nil, for now).

Note: Allocated funds are held in PAC accounts pending provision of actual receipts

DPAC REPORT NOV 12/2024

The October meeting was held on October 17th 2024. This was actually both an AGM and the regularly scheduled meeting. Interestingly, the DPAC only scheduled 30 minutes for the AGM. This turned out to be nowhere near enough.

There was a lot of interest into answers regarding the previous meeting's disclosures of financial irregularities and presumed theft. I spoke at length of how, in my view, the current Executive was taking absolutely no responsibility for anything that had happened and how that was very concerning to me. The Executive was laying blame in a lot of different places but taking very little responsibility of their own.

The vote was pushed forward even though several requests had been made to put it on hold. In that vote, Natalia Nazaroff was defeated by Sheri Pawlyshyn. Sheri has become the new DPAC Chair.

Natalia then went on to request that she be the sole front for the ongoing police investigation. This request was denied as the new Chair would of course need to be involved. Natalia cited a bylaw that only the chair can represent the DPAC and tried to get the membership to vote to give only her access/authority to speak to police.

It was a very uncomfortable end to the AGM.

As Sheri had been surprised to become DPAC Chair, she was not prepared to take over the immediately following DPAC meeting, so Natalia chaired one last meeting.

The AGM itself ended up being over 90 minutes.

I had previous commitments and so had to step out at that point. Lorien can follow up with the events of the actual meeting.
