Dear PAC,

I am writing to express my support for the funding request of \$2,000 for each of the Girls Grade 9 Basketball & Girls Grade 9 Volleyball Teams.

Supporting girls in sport has never been more relevant and important; with the rising popularity of women's professional sports leagues, and the well-known positive effects of sport for girls. According to the Women's Sports Foundation, founded by Billie Jean King, girls who play sports are more likely to get better grades, graduate high school, have higher levels of confidence and self-esteem, a more positive body image, and experience higher states of psychological well-being.

Since Trafalgar expanded to have grade 9 as well, the grade 7/8/9 girls' volleyball and basketball programs have been sharing one set of jerseys. This makes things complicated when they are playing on the same day at different locations, and more challenging for volunteer coaches who manage the equipment. Thank you for also understanding that girl's jerseys fit differently than boys, and require different styles of shorts for basketball, and tops for volleyball.

In preparation for this request, we have identified two potential suppliers and would like to make the purchase this Spring so that the jerseys have arrived and are ready for a successful beginning of the season in the 2025/26 school year.

This investment will benefit many student athletes for years to come and would contribute to the growing culture of girls' sports at Trafalgar.

# Principal's Report

**Grade 10 Course Selection** LVR Vice-Principal Roman Wylie visited all 6 grade 9 classrooms on 11-MAR-2025 to have students complete course selections for next year. There were many good questions from students and lots of good support while choices were entered into the system. Students who missed course selections today can see Mr. Mush or Ms. Foster in the office over the next few days.

**LLE Term 3 Selection** We have built LLE3 and are placing students in 18 different options. We offered 22 LLEs to students and four of them were not considered very exciting by our students since students didn't pick them as one of their four. An example is yoga, where only 18 students picked this LLE.

### **DPAC REPORT**

Another month, another DPAC meeting.

The DPAC has decided, as of now, that they will not be holding a byelection for the chairperson position. For the remainder of this year, it will be held by the Vice Chair.

As mentioned last month, the majority of stolen money has been recovered through insurance. The perpetrator of the theft will not be charged. I spoke against this, as regardless of whether or not the funding was recovered... the person in question still did steal the money. The DPAC agreed, somewhat, but seemed non-fussed.

The speaker this month was Susan Wilson who spoke about Parent Advocacy Training and the benefit of having trained advocates for situations that parents don't feel comfortable dealing with school staff on their own.

I have signed up to go through Susan's advocate training as I feel it would be beneficial to have more varied voices in there.

There was talk of the two committees they've been trying to form. Lorien volunteered and can speak on that.

There was a vote on whether \$2000 should be allocated for travel expenses for two DPAC representatives to the BCCPAC AGM in Prince George. We spoke that as the conference is also online, and given the questionable funding and lost gaming funds this year, this was not an appropriate expense and voted against it. However, we lost that vote and it was approved.

When it came time for me to speak on behalf of activities at TMS, we were told to mention one thing that was exciting and one challenge. I mentioned both the excitement

of our Grade 9 Boys Basketball team and the (at that point) upcoming Wonka Jr. play. For challenges, we mentioned the uniforms that we have been updating this year and the fact that Trafalgar had been promised when the Grade 9's shifted back from LVR that this would be accounted for. The matter was passed to Superintendent Smillie who passed it back to our very own Mr. Mush.

It is my opinion that the DPAC meetings this year have not been worth the time that we've spent attending them. The DPAC has the potential to be of benefit to the whole district... but sadly, very much is not.
